

### NOMINATION FORM – FOR NOMINATION BY 25 MEMBERS 2018 ELECTION

#### Bylaw 3(e) Nomination by 25 Members

Nominations of candidates, who are members in good standing, for president, vice presidents, and councillors may also be made in writing by any 25 or more members or limited licensees who are in good standing. Such nominations, signed by the members or limited licensees making the nomination and accompanied by the written consent thereto of the nominees, shall be in the hands of the registrar not later than 30 days after publication of the list of candidates nominated by the nominating committee.

#### **IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR POTENTIAL NOMINEES**

Service on Engineers and Geoscientists BC's Council is a significant contribution to the public and the professions. Members who make this commitment do so with the understanding that this important role's primary purpose is to serve the public through the dutiful administration of the *Engineers and Geoscientists Act*.

Members of Council have a fiduciary duty to Engineers and Geoscientists BC and must carry out in good faith the duties prescribed to them through the Engineers and Geoscientists BC *Act* and the Bylaws.

#### **DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES TO ENGINEERS AND GEOSCIENTISTS BC**

Engineers and Geoscientists BC and its Council have the duty to uphold and protect the public interest respecting the practices of professional engineering and professional geosciences. As a member of Engineers and Geoscientists BC's Council, you also have a number of duties and responsibilities in your role as a council member. These duties are in addition to the Engineers and Geoscientists BC Code of Ethics.

**Duty of Care:** In making decisions, you must act in the best interests of Engineers and Geoscientists BC and the public. You do not represent a segment of the membership. Decisions are to be based upon facts and reliable information and action is not to be taken without first taking care to be properly informed. You must exercise the degree of skill and diligence reasonably expected from an ordinary person having your knowledge and experience.

**Duty of Loyalty:** You must maintain the confidentiality of information received by you in your capacity as Council member both before and after completion of your term on Council and you must avoid situations where you could put yourself in a position of conflict between your own private interests and the best interests of Engineers and Geoscientists BC.

**Duty of Compliance:** You must carry out Engineers and Geoscientists BC's duties and objects\* and take all necessary and reasonable measures to ensure compliance with laws and regulations as well as policies that apply to Engineers and Geoscientists BC and its Council.

\*Duties and objects of the association from the Engineers and Geoscientists Act, RSBC 1996 Chapter 116 as amended to June 2012.

- 4.1 (1) It is the duty of the association
  - (a) to uphold and protect the public interest respecting the practice of professional engineering and the practice of professional geoscience,
  - (b) to exercise its powers and functions, and perform its duties, under this Act, and
  - (c) to enforce this Act.
  - (2) The association has the following objects:
    - (a) subject to subsection (1), to uphold and protect the interests of its members and licensees;
    - (b) to establish, maintain and enforce standards for the qualifications and practice of its members and licensees;
    - (c) to promote the professions of professional engineering and professional geoscience.

If elected to Council, you will be sworn in at the Annual General Meeting (or, if unable to attend, at the next regular meeting of Council) and presented with the following Oath or Affirmation of Office to sign:

As a member of the Council of Engineers and Geoscientists BC, I declare and affirm that I will carry out my roles and responsibilities to the best of my ability and in the best interest of the public and the engineering and geoscience professions, and that I will adhere to and be bound by the Code of Conduct for Council members.

Council members are expected to sign the Oath or Affirmation of Office to demonstrate that the requirements of the role and the commitment expected is understood.

#### **COMMITMENT**

This role requires a significant time commitment. Councillors usually serve two year terms, the Vice President serves a one year term, and the President serves for two years (one year as President, one year as Past President).

The schedule below outlines the Council meeting dates for 2018/19 Council year. In addition to these <u>full</u> <u>day</u> meetings, members of Council should expect to attend at least one - two hour committee meeting per month and other meetings as called by the President. <u>These meetings usually occur during normal business hours.</u> Candidates should be prepared to commit on average about 10 -12 hours per month in meetings plus preparation time. Candidates should confirm with their employers that they can take time away from the office to undertake these duties as attendance at these meetings is considered mandatory. Council members are also expected to attend a number of engagement activities with stakeholders throughout the year.
